Old Business-

Westminster-Canterbury (WC) High Rise and Memory Center Expansion – Adjacent residents have appealed the Council's approval of the 22 story tower. An update on the current status of the State Supreme Court appeal will be presented.

Dredge Material Transfer Station at Lynnhaven Boat Ramp and Beach Facility – The City approved an ordinance/user agreement to allow private dredging project to use the site to transfer spoils. The community worked with City Staff and Council members to make sure safety, number of truck trips and seasonal restrictions were included as part of the use agreement.

Community Revitalization Guidelines (CRG) – A portion of Shore Drive between the Lesner Bridge and North Great Neck Road will be part of a new plan to propose how commercial property can be developed to revitalize and be compatible with the community. The Bayfront Advisory Commission (BAC) just reviewed the proposed pattern books for this plan. Possible impact and how citizens can comment will be discussed.

Sand Replenishment for beach near Jade Street – The City plans to truck sand from the Lynnhaven Boat Ramp spoils site to the area around Jade Street. An update on the schedule will be presented.

New Business -

SDCC Disbandment and Transition to Online Presence Only – It is the recommendation of the current SDCC officers that the time has come to disband SDCC as an organization and move towards an online presence and information sharing entity. The distribution of remaining SDCC funds is presented below and has been approved by the officers. An official vote to cease as a 501(c)4 organization and move to an online only independently operated entity is recommended. Operations of the new online entity will be discussed.
