CALL TO ORDER:

The meeting was called to order at 3:30 p.m.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

Martin Thomas made a motion to approve the January 19, 2023, Minutes. Bill Hearst seconded the motion. The motion passed with a unanimous vote.

CHAIR'S REPORT:

Vice Chair Bob Magoon reminded the group about the District 8 Community Meeting at 6:30pm on the evening of 2/16/23

STAFF REPORT:

Hank Morrison gave a brief about an upcoming Conditional Use Permit application at the Cape Henry Plaza shopping center (2817 Shore Drive). The application is for a Tattoo Parlor to allow microblading, a permanent makeup technique, to occur within an existing salon (Suite 112). Because of the state's broad definition of tattooing, this cosmetic procedure is required to apply for a CUP as a tattoo parlor. A condition of the permit will limit the establishment to permanent makeup only, and no other type of tattooing will be

allowed on the premises. The hours of operation are 10:00am-6:00pm, Monday-Saturday.

COMMITTEE UPDATES:

Design – Vice Chair Magoon spoke on several topics, including the Shore Drive Overlay Design Guidelines Checklist, Commercial Area Pattern Book, and the pending CIP Request to update the Shore Drive Plan and Design Guidelines.

Communications – Mr. Schubert reported that the January Newsletter has gone out to the public, and there are approximately 140 people subscribed.

Transportation and Public Safety – Mr. Thomas attended the most recent Active Transportation Advisory Committee Meeting and stated he will survey the Bayside beach entrances for appropriate locations for new bike racks.

PRESENTATIONS:

Mr. LJ Hansen was in attendance and gave a brief overview of the purview of the Department of Public Works, providing insight into the encroachments process and how it will change regarding future dune encroachments. The City Council has asked the Dept. of Public Works to look at these types of encroachments more comprehensively. The Dept. is very early on in this process, but before any policy is made, they will involve input from the public, as well as civic leagues, HOAs, and civic organizations like BAC and Beaches and Waterways, if they begin to meet again.

OLD BUSINESS:

A question was raised about how the sand will be moved for active beach replenishment projects.

NEW BUSINESS

Mr. Damon asked about the City's planned schedule for beach replenishment for Chesapeake Beach.

Mr. Schulman gave several updates:

- According to Lynnhaven River Now testing, water quality has returned to normal after the HRSD sewage spill. He is getting an update from HRSD later this month.
- There is a second wind energy project off the coast of NC that is interested in coming onshore in Virginia Beach. There will be a community meeting to engage the public on this matter.
- A Town Hall meeting is being planned for District 9. Community will set discussion priorities prior to the meeting.

COMMUNITY REPORTS:

Mr. Solomon noted that the speed sign by First Landing State Park is no longer working.
